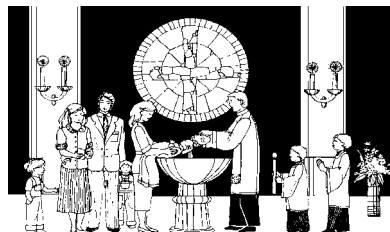

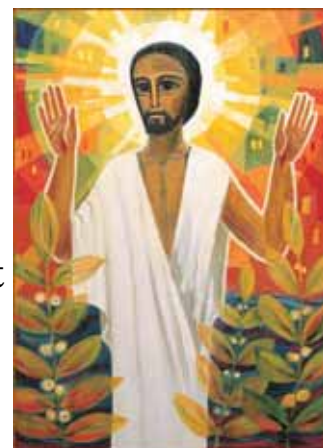

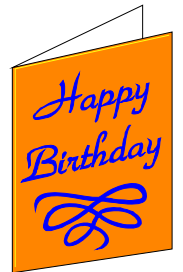

## THE SALESIANS & ST DOMINIC'S HUYTON

Last weekend the Provincial of the Salesians was at St Dominic's Huyton. He told the parishioners that he had recently met with Archbishop Kelly to tell him that, from summer 2013, the Salesians would no longer be responsible for running the parish.

The Salesian Community have been at St Dominic's since 1985; withdrawing from the parish has not been an easy decision for them. In common with so many other religious orders the Salesians have had to face tough decisions as their number fall and priests get older.

It is not clear what will happen when the Salesians leave. The people of the parish are naturally concerned about the future. St Dominic's is part of the Huyton Pastoral Area. There are 7 parishes in the area.

When the Salesians leave in 18 months it is possible that their might just be three priests to cover the 7 parishes. The Huyton Pastoral Area Working Group has been asked by the Archbishop to try and work out some sort of pastoral plan for the whole area. We need to look at how best we can work together to share and rationalise resources so we are equipped to face the challenges of the future.

There are no easy answers.

During the coming months the Pastoral Area Working Group will be meeting regularly.

Please pray for the Working Group, the people of St Dominic's and all the parishes of the Pastoral Area, as we try and work out what God is calling us too in the months and years ahead

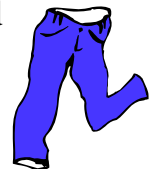
