Taken from Saint Faustina's Diary

For the Benefit of Souls

Meditation:

You have not written everything in the notebook about My goodness towards humankind; I desire that you omit nothing; I desire that your heart be firmly grounded in total peace

(Diary, 459).

January 23, [1937]. I did not feel like writing today. Then I heard a voice in my soul: **My daughter, you do not live for yourself but for souls; write for their benefit. You know that My will as to your writing has been confirmed many times by your confessors. You know what is pleasing to Me, and if you have any doubts about what I am saying, you also know whom you are to ask. I grant him light to pronounce judgment on my case. My eye watches over him. My daughter, you are to be like a child towards him, full of simplicity and candor. Put his judgment above all My demands. He will guide you according to My will** *(Diary, 895).*

My Prayer Response:

Lord Jesus, thank You for making known to St. Faustina the importance of writing her Diary. Thank You for stressing to her that she was to live and write for the benefit of souls like ourselves.

PACT Prisoners' Sunday

Pact is the national Catholic charity working to support prisoners, people with convictions, and children and families. Pact's work is deeply rooted in Catholic Social Teaching. Pact continues to restore hope and dignity to thousands of people affected by imprisonment. Staff and volunteers work in 68 prisons across England and Wales. Their care and practical support help people in prison stay connected with their families. We know that retaining strong family bonds is a significant factor in preventing reoffending.

Today we ask to remember prisoners and their families in our prayers. Prisons are in crisis and life for prisoners and their families in our communities is challenging.

Pact, the national Catholic prison charity support prisoners, their families and their children, offering them hope and the chance to turn their lives around. There will be a second collection to support Pact's important work.



Feasts and Memorials

Tuesday 15th October, 2024

Memorial of St. Teresa of Avila, Doctor and Virgin

1515-82. Teresa was the founder of the reformed (Discalced) Carmelites. She showed religious piety from an early age. Entering the Carmelites, she found the convent relaxed. She however deepened her practice of prayer and meditation. Her visions and other religious experiences by indiscretion on those around her became known and she was misunderstood, ridiculed and even persecuted. Later, along with St John of the Cross, she reformed the Carmelite friars. She wrote *The Way of Perfection* and *The Interior Castle*.

Thursday 17th October, 2024

Memorial of St. Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop and Martyr

Convert from paganism to Christianity. Succeeded Saint Peter the Apostle as bishop of Antioch, Syria. Served during persecution of Domitian. During the persecution of Trajan, he was taken to Rome to be killed by wild animals. On the way, a journey which took months, he wrote a series of encouraging letters to the churches under his care. In his letter to the Romans he wrote "I am God's wheat and shall be ground by the teeth of wild animals. I am writing to all the churches to let it be known that I will gladly die for God if only you do not stand in my way. I plead with you: show me no untimely kindness. Let me be food for the wild beasts, for they are my way to God. I am God's wheat and shall be ground by their teeth so that I may become Christ's pure bread.

Pray to Christ for me that the animals will be the means of making me a sacrificial victim for God". First writer to use the term the Catholic Church. His name occurs in the in the Canon of the Mass. Legend says he was the infant that Jesus took into his arms in Mark 9.

Friday 18th October, 2024

FEAST OF ST. LUKE, EVANGELIST

He was a Greek physician, born of a pagan family, a disciple of St. Paul, and his companion on some of his missionary journeys and the author of both Acts and the third Gospel. Luke emphasises compassion, poverty, prayer and purity of heart.

Other Feasts and Memorials

Monday 14th October, 2024

Optional Memorial of St. Calistus I. Pope. Martyr

Born a slave, Callistus served a sentence as a convict. He was the champion of forgiveness and died for the Christian faith. In 217, he was elected pope and had a short but controversial reign. He is said to have died by being thrown down a well in 222.

Wednesday 16th October, 2024

Optional Memorial of St. Hedwig, Religious

Saint Hedwig of Silesia was born in 1174 at Andechs, Germany she was also known as Saint Hedwig of Andechs, a member of the Bavarian committal House of Andechs, was Duchess of Silesia from 1201 and of Greater Poland from 1231 as well as High Duchess consort of Poland from 1232 until 1238. She died on October 15, 1243, Trzebnica, Poland.

Optional Memorial of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Virgin

Daughter of Claude Alacoque and Philiberte Lamyn, Margaret was born on July 22, at L'Hautecour, Burgundy, France, was sent to the Poor Clares school at Charolles on the death of her father, a notary, when she was eight years old. She was bedridden for five years with rheumatic fever until she was fifteen and early developed a devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. She refused marriage, and in 1671 she entered the Visitation convent at Paray-le-Monial and was professed the next year. From the time she was twenty, she experienced visions of Christ, and on December 27, 1673, she began a series of revelations that were to continue over the next year and a half. In them Christ informed her that she was His chosen instrument to spread devotion to His Sacred Heart, instructed her in a devotion that was to become known as the Nine Fridays and the Holy Hour, and asked that the feast of the Sacred Heart be established. Margaret Mary died at Paray-le-Monial on October 17, the devotion was officially recognized and approved by Pope Clement XIII in 1765, seventy-five years after her death.

Saturday 19th October, 2024

Optional Memorial of Ss. John de Brebeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs

John de Breboeuf and Isaac Jogues with six others were French Jesuitmissionaries in North America in the early 1600's and put to death by Native Americans.

Optional Memorial of St. Paul of the Cross. Priest

1694 - 1775. Paul was an effective Italian preacher, founding the religious Order of Passionists. He was especially interested in the reconciliation of England to the Holy See, an aim pursued by his disciples in the nineteenth century, including Blessed Dominic Barberi or
